In continuation of this Office Notification No.-EG-I/396/24/3809/CHSE(O), dtd.- 14.10.2025, and for further information/clarification of all concerned, the guidelines for adoption of Internal Assessment/Project Examination without having practical or having project components in Arts, Commerce, Science & Vocational Streams are laid down as follows:-

Guidelines for Internal Assessment/Project Examination

1. Internal Assessment/ Project Examination is mandatory for all registered regular candidates.
2. The Internal Assessment/Project Examination of A.H.S. Examination will be held from 22.12.2025 to 31.12.2025.
3. Internal Assessments/Project Examination will be held in Class-XII at the H.S. School level for Regular candidates only.
4. A Regular candidate must secure minimum pass mark of 6 out of 20 (Maximum Mark) and 3 out of 10 (Maximum Mark) in all Internal and Project components of AHSE-2026 respectively.
5. There shall be no Internal Exam/Project work for any Ex-Regular candidate.
6. If a student remains absent in Internal Assessment/Project Examination in a paper/subject, he/she will be declared as **fail**.
7. There shall be a uniform question pattern for Internal Assessment for all the subjects as mentioned in following paragraphs.
8. The question papers for Internal Assessment Test/Project work are to be set by the respective teachers of the H.S. Schools level by the subject teachers of the institution or of other H.S. Schools, in case of non-availability of subject teachers in the institutions or if the subject teacher is debarred from all CHSE activities.
9. Marks awarded in Internal Assessment/Project Examination are to be tabulated, and such tabulation registers for Class-XII are to be kept in lock and key, and will be treated as **TOP CONFIDENTIAL**. The marks awarded in Internal Assessment/Project Examination of Class-XII are part of Annual H.S./Annual H.S. Instant Examination, and so are not to be disclosed to anyone.
10. There will be no computerized mark foils for Internal Assessments/Project Examination.
11. Internal Assessment marks and the corresponding answer scripts of Class-XII are to be preserved till 6 (Six) months after publication of results of rechecking/re-addition of a particular year.
12. For Correspondence Course (Distance Education) students, Internal Assessments will be there for all those papers which are without practical/project components. Internal examination/having project work for the correspondence course students (Regular)

will be conducted through the H.S. School concerned where the student has taken admission on the said course.

13. If a regular candidate failed to appear in the internal /project examination in the first slot (22.12.2025 to 31.12.2025) due to any genuine reason, he/she can appear in same in the second slot in between 10.01.2026 to 15.01.2026. The exact dates of examination in the first and second slot shall be decided by the Principal of concerned HSS.

14. The Project work should be handwritten by the students within 6 pages (A4 Size paper) as assigned by the concerned subject teacher on the topic from the prescribed syllabus.

15. The examinations will be conducted under CCTV Surveillance.

16. The remuneration shall be paid to the personnel for conduct of Internal Examinations/Project Work as per the following rates out of the retained money of Rs.10/- per paper for the said purpose:





Guideline for Internal Assessment

In pursuance of approval of Academic Committee and subsequent decisions in the meeting of respective Syllabus Committees, the guidelines for adoption of Internal Assessment as a part of continuous and comprehensive evaluation system in the subjects or papers without having practical or project components in Arts, Commerce, Science and vocational stream are laid down as follows:

1. From the academic session 2024-25, subjects/papers of Arts, Commerce, Science and Vocational stream for which maximum mark allotted in syllabi is 100(one Hundred) and are without practical/project components (such as all MILs(Odia, English, Sanskrit, Urdu, Hindi, Telgu, Bengali) shall have two components: Internal Assesment (20 marks) and Annual/Test/Final Examination(80 marks). However, in vocational stream, the papers like compulsory English and MILs like Odia, Telgu, Urdu,Bengali,Sanskrit etc, having maximum mark 50(Fifty), total mark for Internal Assesment shall be 10 and total mark for final/Annual examination shall be 40
2. Internal Assessments will be held both in class-XI and class-XII at the H.S.School level.
3. The Unit/Portion dedicated for internal assessment (20 marks) in class-XII will be excluded from Annual/Instant H.S.examination syllabi(80 marks)
4. Total marks to be awarded to a student in a subject/paper having Internal assessment component shall be the total marks obtained in the Internal

Assessment and in Annual H.S Examination from/Annual H.S.(Instant) Examination in that subject/paper.

For example, in Sociology paper (F.M:100), if a student secures 15 marks(out of 20)in internal assessment and 60 (out of 80) in the Annual H.S Examination, then, he/she will be awarded 75 (15+60) marks in the Annual H.S/Annual H. S. Instant Examination, and this will imply that the student has secured 75 marks out of Maximum marks allotted for the paper/subject 100.

5. If a student remains absent in internal assessment in a paper/subject, his/her marks secured in Annual H.S. Examination out of 80 marks/40 marks shall be treated as marks secured from 100/50 as the case may be.
6. There shall be a uniform question pattern for internal assessment for all the subjects as mentioned in following paragraphs.
7. The internal assessment system shall be effective from the session 2024-25 for the students of class XII appearing Annual H.S Examinations 2025 and Students enrolled in Class XI during 2024.
8. There will be one internal assessment for each of the papers/subjects having internal Assessment component in class-XI and XII. The schedule for Internal Assessments for class XI will be notified by the head of institution. Internal assessment tests for class-XII shall be held as per the schedule mentioned in the academic calendar notified by the Council or revised schedule(if necessary) to be notified by the Council in due course of time. The question papers for internal assessment tests are to be set by the respective teachers of the H.S.Schools, and the scripts are to be evaluated at H.S.School level by the subject teachers of the institution or of other H.S.Schools, in case of non availability of subject teachers in the institution. There shall be no remuneration for evaluation of internal assessment scripts.

9. Marks awarded in Internal Assessment are to be tabulated, and such tabulation registers for class-XII are to be kept in lock and key, and will be treated as **TOP CONFIDENTIAL**.
10. The marks awarded in internal assessment of class-XII are part of Annual H.S./Annual H.S. Instant examination, and so are not to be disclosed to any one.
11. Internal assessment marks and the corresponding answer scripts of class-XII are to be preserved till 6(six) months after publication of results of rechecking/re-addition of a particular year.
12. For Correspondence Course(Distance Education) students, **Project paper examination** will be there in place of Internal assessments for all those papers which are without practical/project components. For this purpose, Distance Education Section of the Council will take steps to upload the model topics of Project work to be done in each paper/subject in the council website, and the students are to submit the project work in their respective institutions.
